

Draught-proofing

Is cold air getting in through gaps around your doors and windows?
Here are some options to keep the cold air out.



Self-adhesive draught-proof strips

These are usually available in white or brown and have different profiles. 'E' shaped profiles are suitable for narrower gaps and 'P' shapes are better for wider ones.

Clean the door or window frame, then measure and cut the strip to the required length.

Peel off the backing tape and press the strip firmly into place to cover the gaps.

Draught-proofing external wooden doors

It's easy to seal gaps underneath wooden external doors.

Products are available with either a long brush or a rubber fin and can be cut to size with a hacksaw and screwed to the door.

Before you tighten the screws, make sure the brush or rubber is touching the floor when the door is closed.

Things you may need...



damp cloth and detergent



tape measure



utility knife



screwdriver



hacksaw

TIP!

Keep an eye out for other products like letter box covers and key hole covers.

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
